

The Willemsroute is the tempting alternative for sailing from Roermond or Den Bosch to Maastricht and vice versa. This splendid route is primarily intended for recreational waterway users who want to do more than just sail from A to B. An easily navigable and pleasant route that goes past numerous attractive locations in the Netherlands and in Belgian Limburg.

The route goes via the Wessem-Nederweert canal, the Zuid-Willemsvaart and the historic route through Maastricht to 't Bassin, the atmospheric and historic harbour in the centre of the old city. The Willemsroute is a quiet route with small locks and plenty of mooring sites. The area around the route itself is recreational and highly attractive. There is a minimum of 5 metres headroom on the Willemsroute.*

Visit the Dutch and Belgian provinces of Limburg

If you would like to visit both the Dutch and Belgian parts of Limburg by boat, you should take the Willemsroute, which crosses both provinces. Enjoy all the beauty that the surroundings have to offer. If you have the time, consider taking the branch that goes through a splendid piece of Flanders: the Bocholt-Herentals canal towards Lommel and Leopoldsburg (in Belgian Limburg). But do note: a waterway network toll sticker is needed for sailing on the Flemish part of the Zuid-Willemsvaart.

Work on the Julianakanaal

Rijkswaterstaat – the Dutch Department of Public Works and Water Management – is currently lengthening the locks at the Dutch towns of Born, Maasbracht and Heel. This means that a considerable proportion of the lock capacity on the Julianakanaal is unavailable for some time. To avoid long waiting times and to help recreational traffic such as you, a splendid alternative route is being offered. Have a look at the map for more information about the waterways and the surroundings of the Willemsroute.



Weert

Weert is a good base for trips to the local area and the nearby nature areas. The town is also on the Limburg cycle network. Walking routes and a variety of (boating) arrangements can be obtained from the VVV tourist office and the ANWB.

For waterway users

The transient harbour at Weert has room for about twenty vessels. A variety of facilities are available that can be used after paying a deposit: toilet, water tap, electricity and facilities for emptying chemical toilets and waste water tanks. You can moor there for a maximum of 3x 24 hours. The harbour is close to Weert town centre and the

Lommel

The town of Lommel, a tourist spot in the Kempen area of Belgian Limburg, is a genuine green oasis and commercial centre. It has many nectares of pristine nature, splendid dune and heath landscapes, sky-blue lakes and ponds, and extensive contiguous woodlands with signposted rambling paths.

A unique landscape, and the hottest weather in Belgium in the summer: the Sahara. This 200-hectare nature area is predominated by (white) sand and water. Lommel is more than just nature, though – this lively town has plenty of cultural things to offer too, including the regional tourist/ visitor centre, the museum De Kolonie, the estate De Groote Hoef with its mill museum, the Glazen Huis (the Flemish centre for modern glass art) and the extensive German military cemetery, which are certainly all worth visiting.

De Meerpaal marina is situated in the woods on the Bocholt-Herentals canal, about nine kilometres from the centre. De Meerpaal has forty mooring places with luxury



Maaseik

Maaseik is the beating heart of the Maasland part of Limburg. It's a small town with a big heart for its visitors. Maaseik has everything that a tourist needs: culture, recreation, nature, shops and plenty of cafés and restaurants.

Maaseik has a splendid market square surrounded by historical facades and cosy outdoor cafes. There are also a lot of museums and other sights. The town of Maaseik also has the oldest private pharmacy in Belgium and the oldest gospel book from the Benelux, the Codex Eyckensis. There is also a lot to learn in Maaseik about the Van Eyck brothers, who were born here. The sub-municipalities of Neeroeteren and Opoeteren are excellent starting points for long journeys of discovery in the green Oeter valley. The walking and cycling paths in Maaseik take you to enchanting watermills, quiet spots and the rustic village of Aldeneik with its delicious wine.

For waterway users

Many boats are moored at an old canal branch called "t Eilandje" (4) on the bank of the canal in Neeroeteren-Maaseik. However, a few free spaces are nearly always



available for passing boats. These spaces cannot be reserved. but do call +32 (0)479-652025 to check if there any free spaces. There are facilities here, though. There is a camp site, marina, a meadow for backpackers, a kavak club, brasserie. water-ski club, petangue area and a small play area. The transient harbour of "'t Eilandje" at Neeroeteren-Maaseik is 800 metres from the centre of Neeroeteren. The Heerenlaak marina is the largest marina in the vicinity of Maaseik. This harbour is atmospheric by day and peaceful in the evenings. Heerenlaak has a lot of (recreational) facilities and features. The distance to the centre of Maaseik is three kilometres.

Nederweert

On the border between the Dutch provinces of nburg and Brabant, where three waterways neet, you will find Nederweert. It offers you ature, peace and space, although it also has characteristic town centre, attractive listed ldings, atmospheric outdoor cafes and an pen air museum.

Nederweert can easily be seen on foot. Two well-signposted ANWB walking routes start at the church in Kerkstraat. It is also an excellent place for those who love cycling. Nederweert is on the Limburg cycle network. The splendid Groote Peel national park (1) in nearby Ospeldijk can be admired on foot or by bicycle from the various landing places in Nederweert.

For waterway users

Nederweert has its own transient harbour, where vou can stay for a maximum of two days. The harbour has six moorings with drinking water facilities. There are numerous cafes and restaurants within walking distance of the



Bocholt

The municipality of Bocholt is situated at the nction of the Zuid-Willemsvaart and the ocholt-Herentals canal. It is a small commu n the very north of the Kempen area of Limburg, near the Dutch border: the Bocholt municipal consists of the four villages of Bocholt, Kaulille, Reppel and Lozen.

Bocholt is an ideal place to relax. The many signposted cycling and walking routes and bridle paths such as the Sezoensroute or the Boerderijenroute (farm route) introduce the visitor to Bocholt and its surrounding area. Taste the atmosphere of when the tower was moved in 1910, admire the craftsmanship of the mills, admire the beer brewer's art or meet an alpaca (a type of lama). The sculpture garden full of copper artworks is worth a visit too.

The Heuvelzicht transient harbour was specially constructed for recreational craft in 1994. There is room for twenty boats, which are allowed to stay here for a maximum of 3x 24 hours. Water, electricity, sanitation and a household



Dilsen-Stokkem

Dilsen-Stokkem is a rural municipality in the Maasland area. It is a Belgian municipality consisting of five villages: Dilsen, Elen, Rotem, Lanklaar and Stokkem, Dilsen-Stokkem not only lies on the border between the Netherlands and Belgium, but also between the Maas valley and the Hoge Kempen National Park.

Dilsen-Stokkem has a number of charming village centres such as Stokkem and Oud-Dilsen. Each centre has its own character. Stokkem became known for its thriving wickerwork industry and Lanklaar is known as "the most beautiful corner of Limburg"; they are certainly well worth visiting. But the five centres do have one thing in common: green is the predominant colour. The Rivierpark Maasvallei and Hoge Kempen National Park are great places to cycle or ramble. Dilsen-Stokkem is connected to the beautiful Limburgs cycle route network. You can rent a bicycle or a silent electric boat or visit the wickerwork museum at the Maascentrum De Wissen.

Hamont-Achel

The charming small town of Hamont-Achel is in the Kempen region of Belgium, in the very north of the province of Limburg, close to the Dutch order. Hamont-Achel has a captivating history and striking modern developments. The extensive nature areas and the historical heritage are the ighlights of Hamont-Achel.

Hamont-Achel is one of the key Teutonic municipalities in North Limburg. It is the only municipality in Limburg where Teutons (travelling merchants) and Trappists came together. A lot of the heritage still reminds us of the Teutons. Achel also has the only Trappist monastery in the province. The open agricultural landscape, the extensive nature areas, the scented pine woods, the surprising historical remains in he centre and the lovely green Warmbeek valley make Hamont-Achel the perfect place for ramblers and cyclists Hamont-Achel is right in the middle of the Kempen cycle route network in Brabant and Limburg.

Bree is a beautiful little Belgian town near the Dutch border. Remains of a lively history can be found everywhere in the old town centre of Bree. such as the medieval street pattern. Bree has six subcentres: Gerdingen, Beek, 't Hasselt, Opitter, Tongerlo and Vostert, which are all worth visiting.

Bree is more than a thousand years old. Its centre is small but romantic with the pattern of an old fortified town. With the many shops, cafés and restaurants and listed buildings the town centre is very lively. The most impressive

monument is the restored Augustinian monastery in the centre of the town, which is currently used as the town hall. There are many events in Bree every year. The municipality of Bree is surrounded by the cross-border nature reserve Kempenbroek. With an area of 6,500 hectares, including a silent area and hides for bird-watching, it is a magnificent place for rambling. Bree lies on the cross-border Kempen and Maasland cycle route network.

Bree has two beautifully situated landing stages (3) from which you can get to the centres of Bree and Tongerlo easily

There is a big contrast between old and new in Maasmechelen. On one hand, its mining past still clearly shows, but on the other hand its centre is very modern. Those who like shopping can enjoy the various shopping centres and the well-known Maasmechelen Village Outlet Shopping to their hearts' content. The many nature areas that surround Maasmechelen, such as the Rivierpark Maasvallei and the Hoge Kempen National Park, are ideal places to explore on foot or by bicycle.

Neerpelt

The municipality of Neerpelt consists of the towns of Neerpelt and Sint-Huibrechts-Lille. The River Dommel forms part of the natural oundary with the adjacent municipality of Overpelt. The absence of industry makes Neerpelt an attractive municipality for tourists.

It is delightful to ramble or cycle through the nearby Hageven nature reserve or through the three splendid walking paths in Neerpelt. You can choose from walking routes, cycling routes and bridle paths. And there is no shortage of pubs, cyclists' cafes and eateries and ice-cream parlours. As well as visiting the Lilse Molen (mill) in Sint-Huibrechts-Lille, it is very much worth while visiting the Teutonic village itself. Any nature lover or music lover will enjoy the 'wood of sounds', where a permanent collection of sound-producing installations has been set up outdoors in Domein Dommelhof. Numerous events are also organised every year in Neerpelt (3).

For waterway users Neerpelt-Centrum has its own transient harbour, known as

icipality of Maasgouw consists of ten acteristic centres: Maasbracht, Wessem vensweert, Thorn, Linne, Ohé en Laak, Brachterbeek, Heel, Panheel and Beegden. Each illage centre has its own rich history and sights and should really be experienced.

Walk through intimate and nostalgic streets, across medieval market squares and past listed houses: a visit to Wessem is certainly worthwhile. In Thorn you can enjoy the cosiness of a variety of catering venues within the enchanting ambience of this little white-coloured town. Visitors to Maasgouw can also enjoy sports and (water) recreation to their hearts' content. The various historic village centres are surrounded by magnificent nature areas. Several walking routes (urban and rural) are available from the VVV tourist offices and all the village centres in Maasgouw are connected to the cycle network.

For waterway users

Maasbracht and Wessem are important nodes for recreational craft in the municipality of Maasgouw. There

Kinrooi

Kinrooi. Kessenich is the oldest village.

Opposite the neogothic Sint Martinus church in Kessenich are the ruins of a massive twelfth-century octagonal citadel tower. Kinrooi has become a real municipality for water sports since the extraction of gravel in the outer reaches of the River Maas. Those who like water can enjoy all kinds of water sports here, or go on boat trips or visit the beautiful 'de Steenberg' beach. The municipality of Kinrooi is green as well as blue, though, because Kinrooi and the surrounding areas offer a range of cycling and walking opportunities. Just walk along signposted paths in the nature areas and woods of the cross-border 'Kempen-Broek' area and 'Drie Eigen' in the Maas valley. Follow the blue numbered signposts of the cross-border 'Kempen en Maasland' cycle route network or cycle along one of the theme routes: the Molenroute and the Maasvaartroute. The three windmills and two watermills give the municipality its reputation as a municipality of mills.

Lanaken

anaken lies in the very south of the Maas Border area, just five kilometres from Maastricht. This lgian Limburg municipality is known as the sroads of four regions: Maasland, Haspenouw, Kempen and Mergelland. Lanaken has been owned since 2008 because it includes Oud-Rekem, 'the most beautiful village in Flanders'.

The unspoiled brook valleys and large nature areas make Lanaken an outstanding tourist attraction. The landscape is criss-crossed by rambling and cycling paths. In and around Lanaken there is the Limburg cycle route network, which offers no less than 2,000 kilometres for those who love to cycle. There are numerous top restaurants, small eateries or osy brasseries en route. There are also lots of shops and cultural and historical options too.

For waterway users

Lanaken has two landing places for recreational waterway users. You can moor in the canal basin in Oud-Rekem. at d'Aspremont-Lynden Castle (1). The distance from Oud-Rekem to Lanaken is six kilometres. It is three kilometres to



Rekem. You can find a landing place in Smeermaas near the former customs office. The centre of Lanaken is a good 3 kilometres from the landing stage in Smeermaas. It is only one kilometre to Smeermaas and five to Maastricht. Neither of these landing places has any facilities.

There are four watermills on the Dommel. two windmills and a mill museum, so the municipality of Overpelt is exceptionally well endowed with mills. Moreover, the oldest watermills ever found in the archives were also in Overpelt. and a number of them can still be admired. Overpelt also ikes to promote itself as an artistic municipality: plenty of opportunity to enjoy local art. for instance in various sculpture gardens. Overpelt also has two walking areas that are wonderful to spend time in: Dommelvallei Overpelt and



Holven/Plat.

For waterway users

De Spaanierd marina (1) in Ophoven has space for 930 sailing boats and/or cabin boats of up to 35 metres in length. De Spaanjerd is one of the best extended marinas on the Maas: it has floating landing stages, protected parking spaces, a trailer ramp, a mast crane, a gas station, a shipyard and a camping park with all mod cons. There are four catering venues near the harbour. The distance from the harbour to the centre of Ophoven is one kilometre.

Maastricht

Maastricht has 1.666 historic monuments and numerous museums, interspersed with high-profile architecture. This makes the city on the Maas the backdrop for a cultural voyage of discovery. But you've also come to the right place if you want a day to shop till you drop.

Those who like the good life are sure to have a great time in Maastricht. From Michelin-rated restaurants to cosy pubs serving food – there's something for everyone. Explore the historic inner city during a city walking tour (with a city tour guide, if you want) which starts from the local VVV tourist office. Those who love to cycle can enjoy the vicinity of Maastricht by making the most of the cycle route network of Zuid-Limburg and Belgian Limburg.

Maastricht has two mooring locations: the historic city harbour called 't Bassin and the Pietersplas. The 't Bassin harbour is in the centre of Maastricht. It can accommodate seventy boats. Transients can moor in the harbour for a maximum of 14 consecutive days. There are various



facilities, including sanitary facilities. A modern marina with high-quality facilities can also be found just two kilometres south of Maastricht. This harbour, built in 1993, comprises a comfortable mooring system with very spacious berths.
